It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 23-18.9-17 of the General Laws in Chapter 23-18.9 entitled "Refuse
2	Disposal" is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	23-18.9-17. Food waste ban (a) On and after January 1, 2016, each covered entity and

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4	each covered educational institution shall ensure that the organic waste materials that are
5	generated by the covered entity or at the covered educational facility are recycled at an
6	authorized, composting facility or anaerobic digestion facility or by another authorized recycling
7	method if:

8	(1) The covered entity or covered educational facility generates not less than o	one
9	hundred four (104) tons per year of organic waste material; and	

(2) The covered entity or covered educational facility is located not more than fifteen
(15) miles from an authorized composting facility or anaerobic digestion facility with available
capacity to accept such material.

13 (b) On and after January 1, 2018, each covered educational institution shall ensure that

14 the organic waste materials that are generated at the covered educational facility are recycled at

15 an authorized, composting facility or anaerobic digestion facility or by another authorized

16 <u>recycling method if:</u>

17	(1) The covered educational facility generates not less than fifty-two (52) tons per year or	f
18	organic waste material; and	

19 (2) The covered entity or covered educational facility is located not more than fifteen (15)

- 1 miles from an authorized composting facility or anaerobic digestion facility with available
- 2 <u>capacity to accept such material.</u>

(c)(b) A covered entity or covered educational institution may petition the department for
a waiver of the requirements of subsection (a) of this section if The director shall grant a waiver
of the requirements of subsections (a) and (b) of this section upon a showing that the tipping fee
charged by the Rhode Island resource recovery corporation for non-contract commercial sector
waste is less than the fee charged for organic waste material by each composting facility or
anaerobic digestion facility located within fifteen (15) miles of the covered entity's location.
SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

RELATING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY - REFUSE DISPOSAL

This act would require that on or after January 1, 2018, educational and research 1 2 institutions must recycle all of their food waste if they generate not less than 52 tons per year of 3 organic waste material and are located within 15 miles of an authorized composting facility, unless the requirement is waived by the department of environmental management. Waivers 4 would be granted if the cost to recycle is greater than certain tipping fees. 5 6

This act would take effect upon passage.

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
