It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 27-18-28 of the General Laws in Chapter 27-18 entitled "Accident 2 and Sickness Insurance Policies" is hereby repealed. 3 27-18-28. Health insurance contracts -- Abortion. 4 (a) No health insurance contract, plan, or policy, delivered or issued for delivery in the 5 state, shall provide coverage for induced abortions, except where the life of the mother would be 6 endangered if the fetus were carried to term or where the pregnancy resulted from rape or incest, 7 and except by an optional rider for which there must be paid an additional premium. This section 8 shall be applicable to all contracts, plans, or policies of: 9 (1) All health insurers subject to this title; 10 (2) All group and blanket health insurers subject to this title; 11 (3) All nonprofit hospital, medical, surgical, dental, and health service corporations; and 12 (4) All health maintenance organizations; (5) Any provision of medical, hospital, surgical, and funeral benefits, and of coverage 13 against accidental death or injury, when the benefits or coverage are incidental to or part of other 14 15 insurance authorized by the statutes of this state. 16 (b) Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to pertain to insurance coverage for complications as the result of an abortion. 17 18 SECTION 2. Section 36-12-2.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 36-12 entitled "Insurance
