RELATING TO LABOR AND LABOR RELATIONS - PAYMENT OF WAGES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 28-14-24 of the General Laws in Chapter 28-14 entitled "Payment 2 of Wages" is hereby amended to read as follows: 3 28-14-24. Set-off of money owed by employee to employer. 4 (a) Wages shall not be subject to any deductions, except for allowances authorized by title 28, or otherwise authorized or required by law. Prohibited deductions include, but are not 5 6 limited to: 7 (1) Deductions for spoilage or breakage; 8 (2) Deductions for cash shortages or losses; and 9 (3) Fines or penalties for tardiness, misconduct, or quitting by an employee without 10 notice. 11 (b) In any action for unpaid wages brought under the provisions of this chapter, the 12 employer-debtor shall not deduct as a set-off or counterclaim: 13 (1) Any money allegedly due the employer as compensation for damages caused to the 14 employer's property by the negligence of the employee; 15 (2) Any money allegedly due the employer as rent; or 16 (3) Any money allegedly owed to the employer by the employee; 17 (b)(c) Provided, that any employer granting his employee a loan or advance against future

earnings or wages may deduct the loan as a set-off or counterclaim if evidenced by a statement in

writing signed by the employee. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit or restrict in

- any way any rights which the employer now has to recover, by a separate legal action, any money
- 2 owed the employer by the employee.
- 3 (d) Any employee or former employee aggrieved by a violation of this section shall be
- 4 entitled to the same rights and protections as provided for in §28-14-19.
- 5 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO LABOR AND LABOR RELATIONS - PAYMENT OF WAGES

This act would prohibit employers from deducting from their employees' wages for spoilage, breakage, cash shortages, losses, fines, or penalties for tardiness, misconduct or quitting by an employee without notice.

This act would take effect upon passage.

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
