It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 5-10-8 of the General Laws in Chapter 5-10 entitled "Barbers,

2 Hairdressers, Cosmeticians, Manicurists and Estheticians" is hereby amended to read as follows:

5-10-8. Issuance of licenses -- Qualifications of applicants.

4 (a) The division shall issue licenses to persons engaged in, or desiring to engage in, the 5 practice of barbering, hairdressing and cosmetic therapy and/or manicuring or esthetics and for 6 instructing in any approved school of barbering or hairdressing and cosmetic therapy and 7 manicuring or esthetics; provided, that no license shall be issued to any person under this chapter 8 unless the applicant for the license:

9 (1) Is at least eighteen (18) years of age;

10 (2) Is a citizen of the United States of America or has legal entry into the country;

- 11 (3) Is of good moral character;
- 12 (4) Is a high school graduate or holds the equivalent or has twenty-five (25) or more years
- 13 of prior experience in the practice for which the license is sought;
- (5) Has satisfactorily completed the course of instruction in an approved school of
 barbering, hairdressing and cosmetic therapy and/or manicuring or esthetics;
- 16 (6) Has satisfactorily passed a written and a practical examination approved by the
- 17 division to determine the fitness of the applicant to receive a license; and
- 18 (7) Has complied with § 5-10-10 and any other qualifications that the division prescribes

- 1 by regulation.
- 2 (b) Notwithstanding the provision of subdivision (a)(4), on and after July 1, 1997, an 3 applicant seeking licensure as a barber must be a high school graduate or hold the equivalent 4 <u>combination of education and experience</u>.
- 5 (c) The division may license, on a case-by-case basis, with or without examination, any
- 6 individual who has been licensed as an esthetician, barber, cosmetologist, electrologist or
- 7 manicurist under the laws of another state, which, in the opinion of the division, maintains a
- 8 standard substantially equivalent to that of the state of Rhode Island.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

1 This act would permit grandfathering the licensing of barbers, hairdressers, cosmeticians,

2 manicurists and estheticians on the basis of work experience or work in another state.
