It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 39-3 of the General Laws entitled "Regulatory Powers of 2 Administration" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section: 3 39-3-12.3. Reporting and treatment of incentive payments. (a) No utility regulated by the commission shall be allowed to file its rate schedules or 4 5 notice of changes in rates unless it shall also file a statement containing the following 6 information: 7 (1) A detailed summary of all incentive payments received by the company, including the 8 total earned under each incentive program; and (2) A detailed summary of all actions taken by the company to earn such incentive 9 10 payments. 11 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of the general laws, whether of specific or 12 general application, any incentive payments authorized by law and approved by the commission shall be: 13 14 (1) Considered billed distribution revenue for the purpose of determining any revenue decoupling mechanism adjustment factor authorized by law and approved by the commission; 15 16 and

(2) Considered billed distribution revenue in any future rate case.

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES AND CARRIERS -- REGULATORY POWERS OF ADMINISTRATION--UTILITIES

1 This act would characterize incentive payments to utilities as billed distribution revenue for rate setting services. This act would also require public utilities to file information regarding 2 incentive programs and payments when the public utilities file rate schedules or notice of changes 3 4 in rates with the PUC. This act would take effect upon passage. 5 LC002577
