RELATING TO MOTOR AND OTHER VEHICLES -- MISCELLANEOUS RULES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 31-22-22.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 31-22 entitled 2 "Miscellaneous Rules" is hereby repealed. 31-22-22.1. Child passenger protection -- Warnings of hazard and risk. 3 4 (a) All law enforcement officers in this state are authorized to provide a verbal warning to 5 any person who shall be deemed to have left a child under the age of seven (7) unattended in a motor vehicle. The warning shall apprise the offending person of the dangers of this practice 6 7 including, but not limited to, the risk of kidnapping and/or abduction, and the dangers which may 8 result from the accumulation of excessive temperatures within the motor vehicle. 9 (b) No fine or sanction shall be imposed for a violation of this section, other than a 10 verbal warning, and no record of any kind shall be maintained of the warning. 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 31-22 of the General Laws entitled "Miscellaneous Rules" is 12 hereby amended by adding thereto the following section: 13 31-22-22.2. Child confinement in motor vehicles prohibited. 14 (a) No person shall intentionally or knowingly leave a child under the age of seven (7) 15 years unattended in a motor vehicle for longer than five (5) minutes. For the purposes of this section, a child shall be deemed unattended if not accompanied by a person who is at least 16 17 fourteen (14) years of age.

(b) No person shall leave any child younger than fourteen (14) years in a motor vehicle

for any length of time if the child would be subject to extreme heat or cold or subjected to a lack

1	of adequate ventilation.
2	(c) Any law enforcement officer who has reason to believe that this section is being
3	violated shall have the authority to enter the motor vehicle by any reasonable means necessary to
4	protect the health or well-being of the child. If the circumstances allow, a reasonable effort shall
5	first be made by the law enforcement officer to locate a person responsible for the child who has
6	been left unattended.
7	(d) Any person who knowingly violates subsections (a) or (b) of this section shall be
8	punished by imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or by a fine of no more than one
9	thousand dollars (\$1,000). Any injury sustained by a child caused by any violation of this section
10	may result in a charge of child abuse under §11-9-5.3 or any other applicable provision of law.
11	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR AND OTHER VEHICLES -- MISCELLANEOUS RULES

This act would make it an offense to leave a child under seven (7) years of age
unattended in a motor vehicle for longer than five minutes, punishable by imprisonment for a
term not exceeding one year or by a fine of no more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

This act would take effect upon passage.
