It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 40-6.2-1.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 40-6.2 entitled "Child

2 Care-State Subsidies" is hereby amended to read as follows:

40-6.2-1.1. Rates established.

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4 (a) Through June 30, 2015, subject to the payment limitations in section (b), the

5 maximum reimbursement rates to be paid by the departments of human services and children,

youth and families for licensed child care centers and certified family-child care providers shall

7 be based on the following schedule of the 75th percentile of the 2002 weekly market rates

8 adjusted for the average of the 75th percentile of the 2002 and the 2004 weekly market rates:

4	Effective July 1, 2015, subject to the payment	limitations in subsection (b), the maximum
5	reimbursement rates to be paid by the departments of	human services and children, youth and
6	families for licensed child care centers and certified far	mily-child care providers shall be based on
7	the above schedule of the 75th percentile of the 200	22 weekly market rates adjusted for the
8	average of the 75th percentile of the 2002 and the 2004	weekly market rates. These rates shall be
9	increased by ten dollars (\$10.00) per week for infant/	toddler care provided by certified family-
10	child care providers and license-exempt providers and	then the rates for all providers for all age
11	groups shall be increased by three percent (3%).	
12	Effective July 1, 2017, the above rates establish	ned by the July 1, 2015 rate adjustment, for
13	all providers and all age groups, shall be increased by fi	ve percent (5%).
14	(b) The department shall pay child care provi	ders based on the lesser of the applicable
15	rate specified in subsection (a), or the lowest rate actu	nally charged by the provider to any of its
16	public or private child care customers with respect to ea	ch of the rate categories, infant, preschool
17	and school-age.	
18	(c) By June 30, 2004 and biennially through June	une 30, 2014, the department of labor and
19	training shall conduct an independent survey or certify	an independent survey of the then current
20	weekly market rates for child care in Rhode Island an	nd shall forward such weekly market rate
21	survey to the department of human services. The nex	xt survey shall be conducted by June 30,
22	2016, and triennially thereafter. The departments of he	uman services and labor and training will
23	jointly determine the survey criteria including, but i	not limited to, rate categories and sub-
24	categories.	
25	(d) In order to expand the accessibility an	d availability of quality child care, the
26	department of human services is authorized to establi	ish by regulation alternative or incentive
27	rates of reimbursement for quality enhancements, i	nnovative or specialized child care and
28	alternative methodologies of child care delivery, inclu-	ding non-traditional delivery systems and
29	collaborations.	
30	(e) On or before January 1, 2007, all child of	eare providers have the option to be paid
31	every two (2) weeks and have the option of automa	tic direct deposit and/or electronic funds
32	transfer of reimbursement payments.	

1	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
