It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 27-18 of the General Laws entitled "Accident and Sickness
2	Insurance Policies" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
3	27-18-84. Mandated coverage for pregnant applicants.
4	No pregnant applicant for insurance coverage regulated by this chapter shall be denied
5	coverage due to her pregnancy. Coverage shall be effective as of the first of the month in which
6	her pregnancy is verified by a licensed health care practitioner.
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 27-19 of the General Laws entitled "Nonprofit Hospital Service
8	Corporations" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
9	27-19-76. Mandated coverage for pregnant applicants.
10	No pregnant applicant for insurance coverage regulated by this chapter shall be denied
11	coverage due to her pregnancy. Coverage shall be effective as of the first of the month in which
12	her pregnancy is verified by a licensed health care practitioner.
13	SECTION 3. Chapter 27-20 of the General Laws entitled "Nonprofit Medical Service
14	Corporations" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
15	27-20-72. Mandated coverage for pregnant applicants.
16	No pregnant applicant for insurance coverage regulated by this chapter shall be denied
17	coverage due to her pregnancy. Coverage shall be effective as of the first of the month in which
18	her pregnancy is verified by a licensed health care practitioner.

SECTION 4. Chapter 27-41 of the General Laws entitled "Health Maintenance

- Organizations" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

 2 27-41-89. Mandated coverage for pregnant applicants.
- 3 No pregnant applicant for insurance coverage regulated by this chapter shall be denied
- 4 coverage due to her pregnancy. Coverage shall be effective as of the first of the month in which
- 5 <u>her pregnancy is verified by a licensed health care practitioner.</u>
- 6 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon passage.
