It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1SECTION 1. Chapter 16-22 of the General Laws entitled "Curriculum [See Title 162Chapter 97 - The Rhode Island Board of Education Act]" is hereby amended by adding thereto

- 3 the following section:
- 4 <u>16-22-29. Yearly field trips to nature preserve, reserve, or conservatory.</u>
- 5 The general assembly recognizes the importance of a citizenry well educated in the
- 6 principles of nature and our environment, as well as the general assembly's duty to provide for the
- 7 preservation, regeneration and restoration of the natural environment of the state, as enunciated
- 8 in the constitution of the state of Rhode Island. In light of this, public schools of this state,
- 9 beginning in kindergarten and continuing through and including grade twelve (12), are
- 10 encouraged to use their best efforts to provide access to every student to at least one field trip to a
- 11 <u>nature preserve, reserve, or conservatory.</u>
- 12 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
