RELATING TO MOTOR AND OTHER VEHICLES - OPERATORS' AND CHAUFFEURS' LICENSES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 31-10-26 of the General Laws in Chapter 31-10 entitled "Operators"
 and Chauffeurs' Licenses" is hereby amended to read as follows:

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31-10-26. Issuance of license.

(a) The division of motor vehicles shall, upon payment of the required fee, issue to every 4 5 qualifying applicant an operator's or chauffeur's license. The license shall be approximately two 6 and one-half inches (2 1/2") wide and three and one-half inches (3 1/2") long and shall bear on it 7 a distinguishing number assigned to the licensee, the full name, date of birth, residence address, brief description of the licensee, a photograph of the licensee, whether the licensee has indicated a 8 9 desire to donate tissue or organs pursuant to the provisions of chapter 18.6 of title 23, and either a 10 space upon which the licensee shall write his or her usual signature with pen and ink or a facsimile of the signature of the licensee. No license shall be valid until it has been so signed by 11 12 the licensee designated on it. A negative file of all photographs of licensees shall be maintained 13 by the division of motor vehicles for a period of five (5) years.

(b) The division of motor vehicles shall issue an operator's or chauffeur's license pursuant
to this chapter to every qualifying applicant, including, but not limited to, any current or past
recipient of a grant of deferred action under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)
program, provided any applicant subject to the DACA program shall provide evidence of having
received said grant from the United States Citizen and Immigration Services.

(b)(c) The division of motor vehicles shall issue special licenses to those licensees who
 have indicated that they desire to donate tissue or organs, which conform to the provisions of the
 Rhode Island Anatomical Gift Act, chapter 18.6 of title 23.

4 (c)(d) Any person who is a law enforcement officer, meaning any permanently employed 5 member of the state, city, or town police departments, sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, members of 6 the marshal's unit, capitol police, and the state fire marshal and deputy fire marshals of the 7 division of fire safety or a member of the department of attorney general, any permanently 8 employed federal law enforcement officer assigned in Rhode Island, or any member of the United 9 States Attorney's Office in Rhode Island or any employee of the R.I. department of corrections, as 10 recommended by the director of the department of corrections, upon request of the applicant, 11 shall be issued a license which contains the applicant's official business address in lieu of a 12 residence address as required under the general provisions of this section.

13 (d)(e) The license issued to a person applying for the first time shall be designated as a 14 "first license". A first license shall be issued for a one year period after which time a permanent 15 driver's license shall be issued according to this section.

16 (e)(f) If an applicant has been adjudicated for committing one moving motor vehicle 17 violation, has been involved in one reportable motor vehicle accident, or both, he or she shall be 18 summoned for a hearing before a judge of the traffic tribunal at which time the driving record will 19 be reviewed. The traffic tribunal judge shall determine if the person should be granted an 20 operator's license, be reissued a first license, or be denied a license to operate a motor vehicle in 21 the state of Rhode Island.

22 (f)(g) Any person who is under the age of twenty-one (21) years shall, upon payment of 23 the required fee and upon meeting the qualifications for the receipt of an operator's or chauffeur's 24 license, be issued a license which shall be readily distinguishable in color from those licenses 25 issued to persons who are twenty-one (21) years of age or older. When a person under the age of 26 twenty-one (21) years to whom a license has been issued and whose license is in full force and 27 effect, attains his or her twenty-first birthday, he or she shall be entitled to receive a new license 28 of the type issued to persons who are older than the age of twenty-one (21) years from the 29 administrator of the division of motor vehicles upon demand at no expense. Every person shall 30 supply to the division of motor vehicles satisfactory proof of his or her date of birth.

31 (g)(h) The division of motor vehicles shall issue special licenses upon the request of a
32 licensee which conform to the provisions of the Rhode Island Anatomical Gift Act, chapter 18.6
33 of title 23.

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(h)(i) The division of motor vehicles shall note in an appropriate manner a restriction on

1 any person's license who is prohibited from operating a motor vehicle that is not equipped with an 2 ignition interlock system as provided in chapter 27 of this title.

3 (i) (i) Any personal digitized information contained within an operator's or chauffeur's 4 license shall be limited to: (a) the licensee's name, age, date of birth, address, gender, physical 5 description such as weight, height, hair color and eye color, signature and organ donor status; and (b) the license number, commercial endorsements, expiration date, issue date, restriction and 6 7 class.

8 $(\mathbf{i})(\mathbf{k})$ Except to the extent an entity is authorized to renew drivers' licenses, or except for 9 financial institutions engaged in the verification of information for financial transactions, 10 nongovernmental entities shall not have access to any digitized information contained in an 11 operator or chauffeur's license other than the licensee's name, age, date of birth, signature, and 12 photographic image, and the license's expiration date; nor shall they store, record or retain any 13 such information obtained through a digital reading device. Access to digitized information by 14 such entities shall be solely for the purpose of determining the age of an individual for a 15 transaction, right or privilege available by law only to persons of a certain age.

16 (k)(1) To the extent that nongovernmental entities shall have access to the digitized 17 information stored on an operator's or chauffeur's license, the entity shall be civilly liable for the 18 unauthorized access to, or retention or use of, such information by its agents or persons acting in 19 the name of the entity.

20 (<u>h</u>(<u>m</u>) The division of motor vehicles shall collect from applicants and licensees their 21 social security numbers and tax identification numbers only to the extent required by federal law. 22 Such numbers shall not be included, either digitally or visually, on the operator's or chauffeur's 23 license.

24 (n) Issuance of a Rhode Island operator's license under this chapter to a current or past

25 recipient of a grant of deferred action under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, (DACA)

26 program shall not confer the right to vote in the state of Rhode Island.

27 SECTION 2. Sections 3-8-6 and 3-8-6.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 3-8 entitled 28 "Regulation of Sales" are hereby amended to read as follows:

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3-8-6. Unlawful drinking and misrepresentation by underage persons --30 Identification cards for persons twenty-one and older.

31 (a) It is unlawful for:

32 (1) A person who has not reached his or her twenty-first (21st) birthday to enter any premises licensed for the retail sale of alcoholic beverages for the purpose of purchasing or 33 34 having served or delivered to him or her alcoholic beverages; or

1 (2) A person who has not reached his or her twenty-first (21st) birthday to consume any 2 alcoholic beverage on premises licensed for the retail sale of alcoholic beverages or to purchase, 3 attempt to purchase, or have another purchase for him or her any alcoholic beverage; or

4 (3) A person to misrepresent or misstate his or her age, or the age of any other persons, or 5 to misrepresent his or her age through the presentation of any of the following documents:

6 (i) An armed service identification card, valid passport, the identification card license, or 7 any other documentation used for identification purposes that may belong to any other person 8 who is twenty-one (21) years or older;

9 (ii) A motor vehicle operator's license which bears the date of birth of the licensee, and 10 which is issued by this state or any other state;

11 (iii) A Rhode Island identification card as defined in subsection (b) for the purpose of 12 inducing any licensee or any employee of any licensee, to sell, serve or deliver any alcoholic 13 beverage to a minor.

14 (b) (1) The administrator of the division of motor vehicles shall issue to any person who 15 has reached his or her twenty-first (21st) birthday a Rhode Island identification card upon 16 payment of a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25), and, upon presentation of a certified birth or 17 baptismal certificate, or U.S. or foreign passport, or U.S. naturalization certificate or a valid 18 immigrant or refugee document issued by the United States immigration and naturalization 19 service, including, but not limited to, any one of the following: Form I-551, Form I-94, Form I-20 688A, and Form I-688, and a form evidencing that the applicant is a current or past recipient of a 21 grant of deferred action under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program, together with 22 a document bearing the applicant's signature.

23 (2) A person who has reached his or her fifty ninth (59th) birthday is not required to pay 24 the fee.

25 (3) Each registration card shall be subject to renewal every five (5) years upon payment 26 of a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25).

27 (4) No person who holds an operator's license issued by this state or any other state shall 28 be issued a Rhode Island identification card.

29 (5) The identification card shall be signed by the administrator of the division of motor 30 vehicles and by the applicant and his or her picture shall appear on the card along with the 31 required information and the card shall be encased in laminated plastic. The card shall be two 32 inches (2") in height and four inches (4") in length and shall be printed in the following form: 33

15	(6) The identification cards shall be produced at the adult correctional institutions if they

21	(8) Any person who has been designated as permanently and totally disabled by the social						
22	security administration or who upon certification by an optometrist, ophthalmologist or physician						
23	that a holder of a valid and current motor vehicle operator's license is no longer able to operate a						
24	motor vehicle, the administrator of the division of motor vehicles shall issue to such person, upon						
25	request, a Rhode Island identification card for the unexpired term of such person's motor vehicle						
26	operator's license at no additional cost. Thereafter, a renewal of such card shall be subject to the						
27	standard renewal charge of twenty-five dollars (\$25) until such person shall reach his or her fifty-						
28	ninth (59th) birthday.						
29	(9) The administrator	of the division of	motor vehicles sha	ll, upon p	resentatio	on of a	
30	United States Department of Defense (DD) FORM 214 or other acceptable documentation of						
31	military service and verification of an honorable discharge, issue an identification card to the						
32	presenter which is clearly marked "veteran", at no additional cost.						
33	(c) (1) Every retail Class A, B, C, and D licensee shall cause to be kept a book or						
34	photographic reproduction equipment which provides the same information as required by the						

book. That licensee and/or the licensee's employee shall require any person who has shown a document as set forth in this section substantiating his or her age to sign that book or to permit the taking of his or her photograph and indicate what document was presented. Use of the photographic reproduction equipment is voluntary for every Class A, B, C and D licensee.

5 (2) The sign-in as minor book and photographic reproduction equipment shall be 6 prescribed, published, and approved at the direction and control of the division. The book shall 7 contain at least four hundred (400) pages, shall be uniform throughout the state, and shall be 8 distributed at a cost not to exceed seven dollars (\$7.00).

9 (3) If a person whose age is in question signs the sign-in as minor book or has a 10 photograph taken before he or she is sold any alcoholic beverage and it is later determined that 11 the person had not reached his or her twenty-first (21st) birthday at the time of sale, it is 12 considered prima facie evidence that the licensee and/or the licensee's agent or servant acted in 13 good faith in selling any alcoholic beverage to the person producing the document as set forth in 14 this section misrepresenting his or her age.

(4) Proof of good faith reliance on any misrepresentation is a defense to the prosecution
of the licensee and/or the licensee's agent or servant for an alleged violation of this section.

17 (d) (1) Any person who violates this section shall be punished for the first offense by a 18 mandatory fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than five hundred dollars 19 (\$500) and shall be further punished by thirty (30) hours of community service and shall be 20 further punished by a suspension of his or her motor vehicle operator's license or driving 21 privileges for a period of thirty (30) days; for the second offense by a mandatory fine of not less 22 than five hundred dollars (\$500) nor more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750) and shall be 23 further punished by forty (40) hours of community service and will be further punished by a 24 suspension of his or her motor vehicle operator's license or driving privileges for a period of three 25 (3) months; and for the third and subsequent offenses by a mandatory fine for each offense of not 26 less than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750) nor more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) and shall 27 be further punished by fifty (50) hours of community service and will be further punished by a 28 suspension of his or her motor vehicle operator's license or driving privileges for a period of one 29 year.

30 (2) Any suspension of an operator's license or driving privilege pursuant to this section 31 shall not operate to affect the insurance rating of the offender and any operator's license or 32 driving privilege suspended pursuant to this section shall be reinstated without further expense 33 upon application.

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(e) Within thirty (30) days after this incident the police chief of the city or town where

the incident took place is directed to inform, in writing, the department of business regulation whether or not charges in accordance with this section have been preferred against a person who has not reached his or her twenty-first (21st) birthday and has violated this section. If no charge is brought against any person who has not reached his or her twenty-first (21st) birthday and has violated the provisions of this section, then the police chief of the city or town where the incident took place will state the reason for his or her failure to charge the person who has not reached his or her twenty-first (21st) birthday.

8 (f) The Rhode Island identification card may be withdrawn at any time for just cause, at 9 the discretion of the administrator of the division of motor vehicles. The administrator of the 10 division of motor vehicles shall keep a record of the cards issued and each card shall contain an 11 identification number specifically assigned to the person to whom the card was issued.

(g) Issuance of a Rhode Island identification card under this section to a current or past
 recipient of a grant of deferred action under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, (DACA)
 program shall not confer the right to vote in the state of Rhode Island.

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3-8-6.1. Identification cards for persons under the age of 21.

16 (a) (1) The administrator of the division of motor vehicles shall issue to any person upon 17 request, who is under twenty-one (21) years of age, an identification card upon payment of a fee 18 of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), and, upon presentation of a certified birth or baptismal certificate, 19 or U.S. or foreign passport, or U.S. naturalization certificate, or a valid immigrant or refugee 20 document issued by the United States immigration and naturalization service including, but not 21 limited to, any one of the following: Form I-551, Form I-94, Form I-688A, and Form I-688, and a 22 form evidencing that the applicant is a current or past recipient of a grant of deferred action under 23 the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program, together with a document bearing the 24 applicant's signature. No person who holds an operator's license, issued by this state or any other 25 state, shall be issued an identification card.

26 (2) The identification card shall be subject to renewal every five (5) years upon the
27 payment of a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

(3) The identification card shall be signed by the administrator of the division of motor
vehicles and also by the applicant, and his or her picture shall appear on the card along with the
required information and the card shall be encased in laminated plastic. The card shall be two
inches (2") in height and four inches (4") in length and shall be printed in the following form:
