It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 27-18 of the General Laws entitled "Accident and Sickness
 Insurance Policies" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

- 7 therapist licensed under § 5-40-7 that is greater than the copayment, coinsurance or office visit
- 8 deductible amount charged to the insured for the services of a primary care physician or osteopath
- 9 licensed under chapters 36 and 37 of title 5.
- 10 (b) An insurer shall state clearly the availability of physical therapy coverage under its
- 11 plan and all related limitations, conditions, and exclusions.
- SECTION 2. Chapter 27-19 of the General Laws entitled "Nonprofit Hospital Service
