RELATING TO EDUCATION - SCHOOL COMMITTEES AND SUPERINTENDENTS -BEGINNING OF SCHOOL YEAR

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 16-2-2 of the General Laws in Chapter 16-2 entitled "School
 Committees and Superintendents [See Title 16 Chapter 97 - The Rhode Island Board of
 Education Act]" is hereby amended to read as follows:

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16-2-2. City and town schools required -- School year -- Location -- Kindergartens.

5 (a)(1) Except as specifically provided in this section, every city or town shall establish 6 and maintain for at least one hundred eighty (180) days annually or the equivalent thereof, 7 exclusive of holidays, a sufficient number of schools in convenient places under the control and 8 management of the school committee and under the supervision of the Rhode Island Board of 9 Education. In lieu of a convenient location, the school committee may provide transportation for 10 pupils to and from school in accordance with the provisions of chapter 21 of this title. Provided, 11 that a school district may establish a school year that is the equivalent of one hundred eighty 12 (180) days through the use of longer school days in terms of hours or pursuant to subsection (c) of 13 this section, and that may total less than one hundred eighty (180) separate days, so long as 14 through the use of the longer school day, the school district annually provides a minimum of one 15 thousand eighty (1,080) school hours in a single school year. This figure is based on a minimum of six (6) hours per school day. For purposes of clarification, the intent herein is to permit school 16 17 districts to amend their school year to provide for longer school days while reducing the actual 18 number of days in which the school facilities must be fully staffed and maintained, but to insure

that in doing so, school districts shall still provide the minimum amount of instruction time
contemplated by this section. Nothing herein shall be deemed to limit a school district from
exceeding the minimum amounts of days and hours set forth herein.

4 (2) School districts intending to make use of the option provided herein to lengthen 5 school days and shorten the school year shall submit a detailed school day plan and a proposed 6 school calendar to the commissioner of elementary and secondary education for approval. The 7 commissioner shall review the submitted school day plan and the submitted calendar to determine 8 whether the plan and calendar are academically sound and fiscally efficient. The commissioner 9 may grant or deny approval of the plan and/or the calendar.

(3) Each school district, including charter schools, shall adopt a calendar beginning the
 school year on the day after Labor Day, effective for the school year 2020-2021 and thereafter.

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(b) School facilities shall include a sufficient number of kindergartens.

13 (c) On or before December 1, 2017, the department of elementary and secondary 14 education shall establish a policy that allows a school district to submit a detailed plan, at any 15 time, to the commissioner of elementary and secondary education that would allow the schools to 16 conduct instruction through virtual education when the schools have been closed due to inclement 17 weather or other emergency. The plan for virtual education would be subject to, and require 18 approval by, the council on elementary and secondary education in order to count as a school day. 19 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and shall apply to the school year 20 2020-2021.

- 1 This act would require public schools, including charter schools, to begin the school year
- 2 on the day after Labor Day commencing in the school year 2020-2021.
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This act would take effect upon passage and shall apply to the school year 2020-2021.

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
