RELATING TO LABOR AND LABOR RELATIONS -- MINIMUM WAGES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 28-12 of the General Laws entitled "Minimum Wages" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

28-12-3.3. Minimum wages for employees of developmental disabilities organizations.

5 (a) Commencing July 1, 2019, every covered employer providing services to five (5) or

6 more persons with developmental disabilities, that are reimbursed for such services by the state,

7 shall pay each of their employees, no less than thirteen dollars and seventy-seven cents (\$13.77)

per hour. Commencing July 1, 2020, every covered employer providing services to five (5) or

9 more persons with developmental disabilities, that are reimbursed for such services by the state,

shall pay of their employees, no less than fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per hour. For the purposes of

this section, covered employers are those developmental disability organizations licensed to

provide services pursuant to § 40.1-24-3.

13 (b) The state general revenues and federal funds appropriation to the department of

14 <u>behavioral healthcare</u>, <u>developmental disabilities</u>, <u>and hospitals for services for the</u>

developmentally disabled shall increase for programs that provide services to adults with

developmental disabilities in order to meet the minimum wage increase provided for in this

17 <u>section.</u>

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1	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

RELATING TO LABOR AND LABOR RELATIONS -- MINIMUM WAGES

This act would set the minimum hourly wages for employees of developmental disabilities organizations who have developmental disabilities at thirteen dollars and seventy-seven cents (\$13.77) with an increase to fifteen dollars (\$15.00) commencing on July 1, 2020.

This act would take effect upon passage.
