1 SECTION 1. Chapter 27-20.8 of the General Laws entitled "Prescription Drug Benefits" 2 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section: 3 27-20.8-3. Co-pay cap for prescription insulin. 4 (a) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires, "prescription insulin 5 drug" means a prescription drug, as defined in § 21-31-2, that contains insulin and is used to treat diabetes. 6 7 (b) A carrier that provides coverage for prescription insulin drugs pursuant to the terms of a health coverage plan the carrier offers shall cap the total amount that a covered person is 8 9 required to pay for a covered prescription insulin drug at an amount not to exceed fifty dollars 10 (\$50.00), per thirty (30) day supply of medically necessary insulin. 11 (c) Nothing in this section prevents a carrier from reducing a covered person's cost 12 sharing to an amount less than the amount specified in subsection (b) of this section. 13 (d) The health insurance commissioner may use any of their enforcement powers to 14 obtain a carrier's compliance with this section. 15 (e) The commissioner may promulgate rules as necessary to implement and administer
