SECTION 1. Chapter 23-17.5 of the General Laws entitled "Rights of Nursing Home

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

2 Patients" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section: 3 23-17.5-32. Minimum staffing levels. 4 (a) Each facility shall have the necessary nursing service personnel (licensed and non-5 licensed) in sufficient numbers on a twenty-four (24) hour basis, to assess the needs of residents, to develop and implement resident care plans, to provide direct resident care services, and to 6 7 perform other related activities to maintain the health, safety and welfare of residents. The facility shall have a registered nurse on the premises twenty-four (24) hours a day. 8 9 (b) Commencing on January 1, 2021, nursing facilities shall provide a minimum daily 10 average of four and one-tenth (4.1) hours of direct nursing care per resident, per day, of which at least two and eight-tenths (2.8) hours shall be provided by certified nurse assistants. 11 12 (c) The department shall promulgate rules and regulations in consultation with 13 stakeholders to implement these minimum staffing requirements on or before January 1, 2021.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
