It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 5-19.1-14 of the General Laws in Chapter 5-19.1 entitled
"Pharmacies" is hereby amended to read as follows:

5-19.1-14. Licensing of pharmacists -- Prerequisites -- Examinations -- Reciprocity --

- (a) The director shall license as a pharmacist any individual who shall:
- 6 (1) Be at least eighteen (18) years of age;
- 7 (2) Have satisfied the board that he or she is of good moral and professional character;
 - (3) Hold a baccalaureate degree in pharmacy or a doctor of pharmacy degree granted by a school or college of pharmacy program that is accredited by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education; or is a graduate of a foreign college who wishes to be examined for licensure as a pharmacist in this state and who shall provide evidence of successful completion of
- the FPGEC Certification Program as established in regulation;
- 13 (4) Have completed or have otherwise met the internship requirements as set forth in rules;
- 14 (5) Have satisfactorily passed examinations approved by the board and the director; and
- 15 (6) Have met any additional requirements that may be established in regulations.
 - (b) The department shall, without examination other than those required in regulation relating to the practice of pharmacy, license as a pharmacist any individual who has been duly licensed by examination as a pharmacist under the laws of another state, territory, or possession of the United States, if, in the opinion of the board of pharmacy, the applicant meets the qualifications

- 1 required of professional pharmacists in this state.
- 2 (c) Every application under this section shall be accompanied by a fee as determined by 3 the department in regulation.
- 4 (d) The department shall provide for, regulate, and require all persons licensed as
- 5 pharmacists to periodically renew their license, and shall prescribe the form of the license and
- 6 information required to be submitted by all applicants. The fee to renew a pharmacist license shall
- 7 not exceed the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) on an annual basis.
- 8 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
