SENATE RESOLUTION

DESIGNATING APRIL OF 2021, AS "PARKINSON'S AWARENESS MONTH" IN THE STATE OF RHODE ISLAND

1 WHEREAS, Every April, global communities around the world recognize and support 2 Parkinson's Awareness Month in order to raise awareness for this devastating disease. The theme 3 of this year's event is "Start a Conversation, a call to action that urges people to talk about 4 Parkinson's with their loved ones, friends, neighbors, care team and community"; and WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease is a chronic, progressive neurological disease and is the 5 second most common neurodegenerative disease in the United States, second only to Alzheimer's 6 7 disease. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, it is the 14th leading cause 8 of death in the United States; and 9 WHEREAS, Nationally, Parkinson's disease is estimated to affect between 500,000 and 10 1,000,000 people with 50,000 to 60,000 new cases diagnosed each year. That number is expected 11 to more than double by 2040, making support for the Parkinson's disease community even more 12 important; and 13 WHEREAS, Although research suggests Parkinson's disease results from a combination of genetic and environmental factors, the exact cause and progression of the disease are still 14 15 unknown and as of January 2021, there is no objective test or biomarker with which to diagnose 16 the disease; and 17 WHEREAS, Symptoms of Parkinson's disease vary from person to person and include

tremor, slowness, difficulty with balance, swallowing, chewing, and speaking, rigidity, cognitive

problems, dementia, mood disorders, such as depression and anxiety, constipation, skin problems,

1	and sleep disruptions; and
2	WHEREAS, Millions of individuals in the United States are greatly impacted by
3	Parkinson's disease, including the caregivers, family members, and friends of individuals living
4	with the disease; and
5	WHEREAS, Currently, there is no known cure or drug to slow or halt the progression of
6	Parkinson's disease, and available treatments are limited in their ability to address the medical
7	needs of patients; and
8	WHEREAS, Increased education and research are needed to help find more effective
9	treatments with fewer side effects and to ultimately find an effective treatment or cure for
10	Parkinson's disease; now, therefore be it
11	RESOLVED, That this Senate of the State of Rhode Island hereby proclaims April, 2021,
12	to be "Parkinson's Awareness Month"; and be it further
13	RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and hereby is authorized and directed to
14	transmit a duly certified copy of this resolution to the American Parkinson Disease Association
15	Rhode Island Chapter.
