It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 4-19 of the General Laws entitled "Animal Care" is hereby amended
- 2 by adding thereto the following section:
- 3 <u>4-19-23. Humane transportation of K-9 partners.</u>
- 4 (a) For this purposes of this section "police dog" means: a dog owned by a police
- 5 department or police agency of the State of Rhode Island or any political subdivision thereof, that
- 6 is used by the department or agency for official duties.
- 7 (b) EMS personnel may provide emergency treatment to a police dog injured in the line of
- 8 duty and transport such police dog by ambulance to a veterinary care facility equipped to provide
- 9 emergency treatment to dogs; provided, however, that EMS personnel shall not transport an injured
- 10 police dog if providing such transport would inhibit their ability to provide emergency medical
- 11 attention or transport to a person requiring such services.
- 12 (c) The department of health, in consultation with the Rhode Island veterinary medical
- 13 association, the Rhode Island association of fire chiefs, the Rhode Island state association of
- 14 <u>firefighters, at least two (2) practicing, licensed emergency medical technicians, the international</u>
- 15 brotherhood of police officers' K-9 officer, the fraternal order of police's K-9 officer, and the
- 16 department of state police's K-9 unit, shall develop policies and procedures that include, but are not
- 17 <u>limited to:</u>
- (1) Appropriate training of EMS personnel to provide police dogs basic level first aid,
 cardiopulmonary resuscitation and life-saving interventions, including, but not limited to,

- 1 administering naloxone; provided, however, that nothing in this section shall authorize the
- 2 provision of advanced life support care to a police dog;
- 3 (2) Safe handling procedures for injured police dogs, including, but not limited to, the use
- 4 of a box muzzle and response coordination with a law enforcement official trained in handling
- 5 <u>police dogs;</u>
- 6 (3) Identification of veterinary facilities that provide emergency treatment for injured
- 7 police dogs;
- 8 (4) Decontamination of stretchers, the patient compartment and any contaminated medical
- 9 equipment after a police dog has been transported by ambulance or EMS vehicle; and
- 10 (5) Sterilization of the interior of an ambulance or EMS vehicle before being returned to
- 11 <u>human service, including, but not limited to, sanitizing all allergens and disinfection to a standard</u>
- 12 <u>safe for human transport.</u>
- 13 (d) The department of health may grant a waiver from this section if the department
- 14 determines that compliance poses a safety risk to the public. The department shall develop
- 15 regulations regarding applications and issuance of such a waiver.
- 16 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
