1 SECTION 1. Section 16-16-20 of the General Laws in Chapter 16-16 entitled "Teachers'

Retirement [See Title 16 Chapter 97 - The Rhode Island Board of Education Act]" is hereby

16-16-20. Deduction of amounts received from workers' compensation or as damages.

Any amount paid or payable under the provisions of any workers' compensation law,

exclusive of Medicare set aside allocations, specific compensation benefits or any benefits due

7 pursuant to the terms of a collective bargaining agreement or as the result of any action for damages

8 for personal injuries against the state, on account of the death or disability of a teacher, shall be

9 offset against and payable in lieu of any benefits payable out of funds provided by the state under

10 the provisions of this chapter on account of the death or disability of the teacher. If the value of the

total commuted benefits under any workers' compensation law or action is less than the present

12 value on an actuarial basis of the benefits otherwise payable under this chapter, the value of the

commuted payments shall be deducted from the present value of the benefits, and the balance

thereof shall be payable under the provisions of this chapter.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
