It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 45-2 of the General Laws entitled "General Powers" is hereby 2 amended by adding thereto the following section: 3 45-2-68. Local snowstorm communication requirement.

(a) Every municipality within the State of Rhode Island shall be required to provide notice to residents, within at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to any forecasted snowstorm, of street parking bans, and trash pickup delays or cancellations, utilizing technological communication devices including, but not limited to, electronic, digital media, telephonic or any other method available to advise the public.

9 (b) Every municipality in the State of Rhode Island shall also provide public parking to enable residents to park their automobiles during parking bans, limited, however, to the duration of 10 11 the parking ban plus two (2) hours.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
