RELATING TO EDUCATION -- RHODE ISLAND CERTIFICATION STANDARDS BOARD (SEE TITLE 16 CHAPTER 97 - THE RHODE ISLAND BOARD OF EDUCATION ACT)

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 16-11.4-6 of the General Laws in Chapter 16-11.4 entitled "Rhode

Island Certification Standards Board [See Title 16 Chapter 97 - The Rhode Island Board of

Education Act]" is hereby amended to read as follows:

### 4 16-11.4-6. Right to read act.

(a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Right to Read Act."

(b) No later than 2025, the following shall have proficient knowledge and skills to teach

reading consistent with the best practices of scientific reading instruction and structured literacy

instruction:

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(1) A person who completes a state-approved educator preparation program; and

(2) A person seeking teacher licensure by reciprocity or by adding an endorsement.

In addition, no later than 2025, a person who completes a state-approved educator

preparation program, other than a teacher of elementary education program, shall demonstrate an

awareness of the best practices of scientific reading instruction and structured literacy instruction. 13

14 (c) Beginning no later than the 2024-2025 school year, each state-approved educator

15 preparation program shall post on its website information describing its program to prepare teachers

to teach reading with scientific reading instruction and structured literacy instruction; aligned with, 16

but not limited to, the content measured by the stand-alone reading assessment adopted by the

Rhode Island board of education act. 18

1	(d) Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, a public school district and an open-
2	enrollment public charter school shall provide the following professional development in scientific
3	reading instruction and structured literacy instruction:
4	(1) For teachers licensed at the elementary level, professional development for one of the
5	prescribed pathways to obtaining a proficiency credential in knowledge and practices in scientific
6	reading instruction and structured literacy instruction; and
7	(2) For teachers licensed at a level other than the elementary level, professional
8	development for one of the prescribed pathways to obtaining an awareness credential in knowledge
9	and practices in scientific reading instruction and structured literacy instruction.
10	(e) Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, a public school that does not provide the
11	professional development pursuant to the provisions of subsection (d) shall:
12	(1) Be placed on probationary status; and
13	(2) Provide notice to parents that the public school district has not met the requirements of
14	this section.
15	(f) By the beginning of the <del>2023-2024</del> <u>2025-2026</u> school year:
16	(1) All teachers employed in a teaching position that requires an elementary education (K-
17	6) license or (K-12) license shall demonstrate proficiency in knowledge and practices of scientific
18	reading and structured literacy instruction; and
19	(2) All other teachers shall demonstrate awareness in knowledge and practices of scientific
20	reading instruction and structured literacy instruction.
21	(g) All teachers who begin employment in the 2023-2024 2025-2026 school year and each
22	school year thereafter shall demonstrate proficiency or awareness in knowledge and practices in
23	scientific reading instruction and structured literacy instruction as is applicable to their teaching
24	position by completing the prescribed proficiency or awareness in knowledge and practices of the
25	scientific reading instruction credential and a structured literacy instruction credential either:
26	(1) As a condition of licensure; or
27	(2) Within one year if the teacher is:
28	(i) Already licensed; or
29	(ii) Employed under a waiver from licensure.
30	(h) A provider of a state-approved educator preparation program shall include in its annual
31	report to the department of elementary and secondary education (the "department") a description
32	of program to prepare educators to teach reading using scientific reading instruction and structured
33	literacy instruction.
34	(i) A public school district that employs an educator in violation of this section or that does

2	standards for accreditation of the Rhode Island board of education act, and the school district may
3	be placed on probationary status by the department. A public school district placed on probationary
4	status pursuant to the provisions of this subsection shall send written notification to the parents of
5	the students in the public school district of the reason for being placed on probationary status.
6	(j) A provider of a state-approved educator preparation program that does not comply with
7	the requirements of this section may be subject to penalties up to and including having the
8	provider's approval status revoked.
9	(k) The department is vested with the authority to, and shall enforce, this section.
10	(l) The department shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section no
11	later than August 1, 2022.
12	(1) The rules and regulations adopted by the department shall recognize that teachers shall
13	have met the requirement of demonstrating awareness in knowledge and practices of scientific
14	reading and structured literacy instruction by attending ten (10) hours of training in scientific
15	reading and structured literacy instruction.
16	(2) The rules and regulations adopted by the department shall recognize that teachers shall
17	have met the requirement of demonstrating proficiency in knowledge and practices of scientific
18	reading and structured literacy instruction by one of the following:
19	(i) Possessing a Master's degree in reading or a related academic discipline;
20	(ii) Possessing a reading specialist and/or consultant certificate;
21	(iii) Providing proof of completion of a course or training program in scientific reading and
22	structured literacy instruction consisting of at least thirty (30) hours; or
23	(iv) Passing a test in scientific reading and structured literacy instruction adopted by the
24	department at no cost to the teacher.
25	(m) Teachers shall not be required to attend training sessions outside the normal workday
26	and work year unless mutually agreed to by the teacher, the school district, and the collective
27	bargaining agent if applicable.
28	(n) For the 2022-2023, 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 school years, school districts shall be
29	able to replace up to three (3) student instructional days per year with teacher professional
30	development days in order to meet the requirements of this section.
31	(m)(o) As used in this section:
32	(1) The term "scientific reading instruction" means instruction that is instructional
33	centered, empirically based, and further based on the study of the relationship between cognitive
34	science and educational outcomes; and

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- 1 (2) The term "structured literacy instruction" means an approach by which licensed 2 personnel teach reading, which includes syllables, morphology, sound-symbol correspondence,
- 3 semantics, and syntax, in an explicit, systematic, and diagnostic manner.

4 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

# RELATING TO EDUCATION -- RHODE ISLAND CERTIFICATION STANDARDS BOARD (SEE TITLE 16 CHAPTER 97 - THE RHODE ISLAND BOARD OF EDUCATION ACT)

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This act would extend the time period from the school year 2023-2024 until 2025-2026 to 2 require all teachers to demonstrate proficiency in knowledge and practices of scientific reading and 3 structured literacy instruction. This act would further extend the time period from the school year 2023-2024 until 2025-2026 requiring all new hires for a teaching position to demonstrate an 5 awareness in knowledge and practices of the scientific reading instruction credential and a structured literacy instruction credential as a condition of hire, or within one year of hire, if already 6 7 licensed. A teacher may demonstrate such knowledge and practice by: (1) Possessing a Master's 8 degree in reading; (2) Possessing a reading specialist and/or consultant certificate; (3) Providing proof of completion of a course or training program in scientific reading instruction; (4) Passing a 9 10 test in scientific readings and structured literacy instruction. The department shall issue rules and regulations in regards to this act no later than August 1, 2022.

This act would take effect upon passage.

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
