It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 16-16 of the General Laws entitled "Teachers' Retirement [See Title 2 16 Chapter 97 — The Rhode Island Board of Education Act]" is hereby amended by adding thereto 3 the following section: 4 16-16-24.2. Substitute teaching and post-retirement employment related to statewide staffing. 5 6 (a) Notwithstanding any public or general law, or rule or regulation to the contrary, any 7 teacher, administrator, or staff member who has retired under the provisions of title 16, 36, or 45 8 may exceed the ninety (90) day cap on post-retirement employment upon: 9 (1) A determination by the local education authority that there exists a specialized need, 10 within their authority, to fill positions on a temporary basis, that may exceed the ninety (90) day 11 cap on post-retirement employment; 12 (2) Retired teachers, administrators, and staff members being asked to exceed the ninety 13 (90) day cap on post-retirement employment possess the skills, training, and knowledge necessary to help address teacher and administrative staffing shortages; and 14 15 (3) The local education authority has notified the state retirement board that it has determined that exceeding the ninety (90) day cap on post-retirement employment is necessary to 16 help address teacher and administrative staffing shortages. 17 18 Provided, however, that no employment may be offered to a retiree subject to this section

unless the employer has made a good-faith effort each school year to fill the position with a

- 1 <u>nonretired employee without success, and certifies, in writing, that it has done so to the employees'</u>
- 2 retirement system and to the bargaining agents of all education unions with whom the employer
- 3 <u>has collective bargaining agreements.</u>
- 4 (b) Any teacher, administrator, or staff member who has retired under the provisions of
- 5 <u>title 16, 36, or 45, and has been employed or re-employed under the provisions of this section, shall</u>
- 6 not be entitled to additional service credits for such employment.
- 7 (c) Unless extended by the general assembly, this section shall sunset on June 20, 2024.
- 8 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and sunset on June 20, 2024.

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

RELATING TO EDUCATION -- TEACHERS' RETIREMENT

This act would add a section which allows substitute teachers and post-retirement employees to exceed the ninety (90) day cap on post-retirement employment if certain conditions are met.

This act would take effect upon passage and sunset on June 20, 2024.

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
