HOUSE RESOLUTION

CREATING A SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION TO STUDY AND PROVIDE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF AN ANTI-LITTERING EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR RHODE ISLAND PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

Referred To: House Education

1 RESOLVED, That a special legislative commission be and the same is hereby created consisting of nine (9) members: three (3) of whom shall be members of the House of 2 3 Representatives, not more than two (2) from the same political party, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; one of whom shall be the President of the Rhode Island Association of 4 5 School Committees, or designee; one of whom shall be the President of the Rhode Island Association of Administrators, or designee; one of whom shall be the President of the Rhode 6 Island Association of Administrators of Special Education, or designee; one of whom shall be the 7 President of the Rhode Island Chapter of the American Federation of Teachers, or designee; one 8 9 of whom shall be the President of the Rhode Island Chapter of the National Education 10 Association, or designee; and one of whom shall be the Commissioner of Elementary and 11 Secondary Education, or designee.

In lieu of any appointment of a member of the legislature to a permanent advisory commission, a legislative study commission, or any commission created by a General Assembly resolution, the appointing authority may appoint a member of the general public to serve in lieu of a legislator, provided that the majority leader or the minority leader of the political party which is entitled to the appointment consents to the appointment of the member of the general public.

17 The purpose of said commission shall be to study and make recommendations for the 18 development and implementation of an anti-littering education program for elementary students 1 in Rhode Island's public schools.

Forthwith upon passage of this resolution, the members of the commission shall meet at
the call of the Speaker of the House and organize and shall select, from among the legislators, a
chairperson.

5 Vacancies in said commission shall be filled in like manner as the original appointment.

6 The membership of said commission shall receive no compensation for their services.

All departments and agencies of the state shall furnish such advice and information,
documentary and otherwise, to said commission and its agents as is deemed necessary or
desirable by the commission to facilitate the purposes of this resolution.

10 The Speaker of the House is hereby authorized and directed to provide suitable quarters11 for said commission; and be it further

12 RESOLVED, That the commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the 13 House of Representatives no later than February 2, 2023, and said commission shall expire on 14 April 2, 2023.

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

HOUSE RESOLUTION

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1 This resolution would create a nine (9) member special legislative commission whose 2 purpose it would be to study and make recommendations for the development and 3 implementation of an anti-littering education program for elementary students in Rhode Island's 4 public schools, and who would report back to the House of Representatives on or before February 5 2, 2024, and whose life would expire on April 2, 2024.

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
