#### HOUSE RESOLUTION

### HONORING LINCOLN FIRE CHIEF RICHARD ANDREWS FOR MORE THAN FIFTY YEARS OF DEVOTED AND DEDICATED SERVICE

1 WHEREAS, For retired Lincoln Fire Chief Richard Andrews, public service and a career 2 in fire safety were a family tradition. His father, the late Earl Andrews, Sr., was the Fire Chief of 3 Saylesville until 1984, and inspired Richard to begin a career in fire safety. His two brothers were 4 also volunteer firemen, and his late brother, Bruce Andrews, was the Deputy Fire Chief in 5 Saylesville. Chief Andrews's son, Michael, currently serves as the Fire Chief in Wilbraham, 6 Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS, Chief Richard Andrews began his distinguished public service career in 1970, at the young age of sixteen, serving as a volunteer firefighter in Saylesville. He later proceeded to serve as a firefighter for nineteen years, rising to the rank of Captain in 1989. In 2008, he was promoted to the position of Chief; and

WHEREAS, During his time as Chief, Mr. Andrews, thanks to his strong leadership skills and tireless work ethic, was able to facilitate the consolidation of the Saylesville and Albion Fire Districts into one unified district, the Lincoln Fire District, something that had been attempted, without success, since the 1980s. Accomplishing this task allowed the new consolidated district to pool funds and stabilize the tax rate for all residents; and

WHEREAS, Chief Andrews led his department through the most difficult times of the COVID-19 pandemic, a period during which personnel were constantly forced to miss work due to illness or out of fear of bringing the virus to their families and loved ones. Thanks to his excellent communication skills and administrative acumen, his department was able to come out 1 of the pandemic in strong shape; and

WHEREAS, Chief Andrews, a lifelong Lincoln resident, stated that he remembers back in 1970, when the fire district would get approximately 70 calls a year, while today it gets approximately 3,300 a year. Most recently, he and his team were faced with the devastating fire that hit the Knock On Wood Furniture store, and successfully put out the fire and made sure that it did not spread to any homes; and

WHEREAS, Michael Allen, the Fire Commission Chairperson, and someone who volunteered alongside Chief Andrews as a teenager, described the legacy of Chief Andrews best when he stated that he has "the highest level of respect for Andrews", "he has a level head and an even temper, that's hard to find", and "It breaks my heart that he left, but he made sure that this department was up to snuff. He gave back to the community. He is a good man"; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That this House of Representatives of the State of Rhode Island hereby congratulates Lincoln Fire Chief Richard Andrews on his retirement and thanks him for his more than fifty years of exemplary public service. We furthermore wish him a most happy retirement with his wife Paula, and his two children, two step-children, and nine grandchildren. We also wish him continued success in all of his future endeavors; and be it further
