It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 16-16 of the General Laws entitled "Teachers' Retirement [See Title
- 2 16 Chapter 97 The Rhode Island Board of Education Act]" is hereby amended by adding thereto
- 3 the following section:
 - 16-16-24.2. Substitute teaching and post-retirement employment related to statewide
- 5 staffing.

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- 6 (a) Notwithstanding any public or general law, or rule or regulation to the contrary, any
- 7 teacher, administrator, or staff member who has retired under the provisions of title 16, 36, or 45
- 8 may exceed the ninety (90) day cap on post-retirement employment upon:
- 9 (1) A determination by the local education authority that there exists a specialized need,
- 10 within their authority, to fill positions on a temporary basis, that may exceed the ninety (90) day
- 11 <u>cap on post-retirement employment;</u>
- 12 (2) Retired teachers, administrators, and staff members being asked to exceed the ninety
- 13 (90) day cap on post-retirement employment possess the skills, training, and knowledge necessary
- 14 to help address teacher and administrative staffing shortages; and
- 15 (3) The local education authority has notified the state retirement board that it has
- 16 determined that exceeding the ninety (90) day cap on post-retirement employment is necessary to
- 17 <u>help address teacher and administrative staffing shortages.</u>
- 18 Provided, however, that no employment may be offered to a retiree subject to this section
- 19 unless the employer has made a good-faith effort each school year to fill the position with a

- 1 nonretired employee without success, and certifies, in writing, that it has done so to the employees'
- 2 retirement system and to the bargaining agents of all education unions with whom the employer
- 3 <u>has collective bargaining agreements.</u>
- 4 (b) Any teacher, administrator, or staff member who has retired under the provisions of
- 5 title 16, 36, or 45, and has been employed or re-employed under the provisions of this section, shall
- 6 <u>not be entitled to additional service credits for such employment.</u>
- 7 (c) Unless extended by the general assembly, this section shall sunset on June 20, 2024.
- 8 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and sunset on June 20, 2024.

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION -- TEACHERS' RETIREMENT

1 This act would add a section which allows substitute teachers and post-retirement 2 employees to exceed the ninety (90) day cap on post-retirement employment if certain conditions 3 are met.

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This act would take effect upon passage and sunset on June 20, 2024.

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
