RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT -- EMERGENCY SHELTERS

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Title 42 of the General Laws entitled "STATE AFFAIRS AND
2	GOVERNMENT" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following chapter:
3	<u>CHAPTER 128.4</u>
4	EMERGENCY SHELTERS
5	42-128.4-1. Definitions.
6	As used in this chapter, the term:
7	(1) "Emergency shelter" means a facility with overnight sleeping accommodations, the
8	primary purpose of which is to provide temporary shelter for the homeless in general or for specific
9	populations of the homeless.
10	(2) "Housing resources commission" or "commission" means the Rhode Island housing
11	resources commission established pursuant to § 42-128-4.
12	(3) "Licensing agency" means the secretary of housing established pursuant to § 42-64.19-
13	<u>3(a)(4), or designee.</u>
14	42-128.4-2. Licensing and exemption.
15	(a) The housing resources commission shall establish an application for an emergency
16	shelter license no later than January 1, 2026. Upon receipt of an application for a license, the
17	licensing agency shall issue a license if the applicant meets the requirements established pursuant
18	to this chapter. A license issued under the provisions of this section shall be the property of the

state and loaned to the licensee, and it shall be posted in a conspicuous place on the licensed

1	premises. Each needse shan be issued only for the premises and persons named in the apprention,
2	and shall not be transferable or assignable except with the written approval of the commission. No
3	fee shall be charged for the license.
4	(b) Any emergency shelter established due to a natural disaster, impending dangerous
5	storm, or other event, including, but not limited to, fires, hurricanes or blizzards, shall be exempt
6	from this chapter.
7	42-128.4-3. Minimum shelter standards.
8	(a) All emergency shelters that are required to be licensed shall:
9	(1) Provide a safe place for a person to temporarily reside. Safety of residents and staff
10	shall be the shelters' top priority;
11	(2) Make drinking water available to residents and proper bathroom facilities as required
12	by the state building code in chapter 27.3 of title 23;
13	(3) Develop a written policy regarding the privacy and confidentiality of its residents as
14	required by state and federal law; and
15	(4) Establish an approved procedure for the safe transfer of a person seeking shelter or
16	having been sheltered at the licensed premises, who can no longer reside in the shelter at the
17	licensed premises in question. The established procedure shall be posted in a conspicuous place on
18	the licensed premises that is in an area accessed frequently by residents.
19	(b) The housing resources commission shall promulgate additional minimum shelter
20	standards that shall apply to emergency shelters that are at least partially funded by the state, no
21	later than December 1, 2026.
22	42-128.4-4. Grievance procedure.
23	The housing resource commission shall promulgate a grievance procedure designed to
24	address complaints of persons who have resided or attempted to reside in any emergency shelter
25	within this state. Grievance procedures shall be posted in the licensed premises in a conspicuous
26	place accessed frequently by residents.
27	42-128.4-5. Fees prohibited.
28	Any fees or payments of money for the purposes of providing shelter and personal care
29	items, including, but not limited to, linens, toiletries and diapers shall be prohibited unless
30	otherwise allowable by state or federal law. Resident funds provided to a shelter for the purposes
31	of teaching financial literacy or creating a "savings account" are permitted if the funds are returned
32	to the resident at the appropriate time or upon request.

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
