SENATE RESOLUTION

COMMEMORATING JANUARY OF 2025, AS "RHODE ISLAND SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING PREVENTION MONTH" IN THE STATE OF RHODE ISLAND

<u>Introduced By:</u> Senator E Morgan <u>Date Introduced:</u> February 04, 2025 Referred To: Recommended for Immediate Consideration

1 WHEREAS, Human trafficking, as recognized and defined by the United Nations in the 2 "Trafficking Protocol" is the "recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring or receipt of 3 persons, by means of threat or use of force or other forms of coercion, of abduction, of fraud, of 4 deception,...for the purpose of exploitation." Exploitation can include forced prostitution and 5 other forms of sexual exploitation as well as forced labor. Women and children are particularly 6 vulnerable to being exploited in these ways; and

WHEREAS, It is estimated that 27.6 million people are currently the victims of human
trafficking worldwide and are being used as slaves in some capacity. The International Labour
Office (ILO), estimates that human trafficking generates approximately \$236 billion dollars in
profit; and

WHEREAS, National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month was first observed in January, 2018 and more than \$45 million was contributed to the Global Fund to End Modern Slavery, which provided for enhanced collaboration amongst nations and their law enforcement and other community and business organizations in order to dismantle transnational criminal organizations that are involved in human trafficking activities. In 2024, more than \$75 million was raised; now, therefore be it
