**FLOOR AMENDMENT
TO
2004 -- H 7368**

AN ACT RELATING TO DOMESTIC RELATIONS-DOMESTIC ABUSE PREVENTION

Mr. Speaker:

I hereby move to amend 2004 -- H 7368, entitled "AN ACT RELATING TO DOMESTIC RELATIONS-DOMESTIC ABUSE PREVENTION", as follows:

By deleting all of the language following the enactment clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

"SECTION 1. Legislative Intent – In 1994 federal laws were enacted to prevent domestic violence abusers from purchasing and/or possessing firearms. Forty (40) states have enacted laws that restrict the possession of firearms in cases of domestic violence. It is the intent of the general assembly that the provisions of this act apply only to protective orders which are issued by a court after notice is given to the respondent and a full hearing on the complaint has taken place. It shall not apply to temporary orders of protection under section 15-15-4 or 8-8.1-4.

SECTION 2. Section 15-15-3 of the General Laws in Chapter 15-15 entitled "Domestic Abuse Prevention" is hereby amended to read as follows:

15-15-3. Protective orders -- Penalty -- Jurisdiction. -- (a) A person suffering from domestic abuse may file a complaint in the family court requesting any order which will protect and support her or him from abuse including, but not limited, to the following:

(1) Ordering that the defendant be restrained and enjoined from contacting, assaulting, molesting, or interfering with the plaintiff at home, on the street, or elsewhere, whether the defendant is an adult or a minor;

(2) Ordering the defendant to vacate the household immediately;

(3) Awarding the plaintiff custody of the minor children of the parties, if any;

(4) After notice to the respondent and a hearing, ordering either party to make payments for the support of a minor child or children of the parties as required by law for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, unless the child support order is for a child or children receiving public

assistance pursuant to chapter 5.1 of title 40. In these cases, legal counsel for the division of taxation, child support enforcement, shall be notified as a party in interest to appear for the purpose of establishing a child support order under a new or existing docket number previously assigned to the parties and not under the protective docket number. The child support order shall remain in effect until the court modifies or suspends the order; and

(5) After notice to the respondent and a hearing, the court may order the defendant to surrender all firearms in his or her possession, care, custody or control to their local police department.

(b) The Family Court shall provide a notice on all forms requesting a protective order that, at the hearing for a protective order, the defendant may be ordered to relinquish possession or control of any firearms and not to purchase or receive or attempt to purchase or receive any firearms for a period not to exceed the duration of the restraining order.

(c) If the defendant is present in court at a duly noticed hearing, the court may order the defendant to relinquish any firearm in that person's immediate possession or control, or subject to that person's immediate possession or control, within twenty-four (24) hours of the order, by surrendering the firearm(s) to the control of local law enforcement officials or by selling the firearm(s) to a federally licensed gun dealer. If the defendant is not present at the hearing, the defendant shall relinquish the firearm(s) within forty-eight (48) hours after being served with the order. A person ordered to relinquish any firearm pursuant to this subdivision shall file with the court a receipt showing the firearm(s) was either surrendered to the local law enforcement agency or federally licensed firearm storage facility or sold to a licensed gun dealer within seventy-two (72) hours after receiving the order.

(d) A local or state law enforcement agency may charge the defendant a fee for the storage of any firearm pursuant to this section. This fee shall not exceed the actual cost incurred by the local or state law enforcement agency for the storage of the firearm(s). For purposes of this subdivision, "actual cost" means expenses directly related to taking possession of the firearm(s), storing the firearm(s), and surrendering possession of the firearm(s) to a federally licensed firearms storage facility or to the defendant.

(e) Nothing in this section shall limit a defendant's right under existing law to petition the court at a later date for modification of the order.

(f) Unless otherwise prohibited by law, the offender shall have twenty (20) days from the expiration or termination date of the order to retrieve the firearm(s). If the legal owner of any firearm(s) deposited with the local or state law enforcement agency is otherwise prohibited by law from possessing or owning any firearm(s), said owner shall be entitled to sell or transfer the firearm(s) to a federally licensed firearms dealer and, if so, shall file a notarized receipt of said transfer/sale with the court. If the firearm(s) is not retrieved within the grace period, the law enforcement agency shall be entitled to destroy the firearm(s) at the defendant's expense.

(g) The prohibition against possessing a firearm due solely to the existence of a domestic violence restraining order issued under this section shall not apply with respect to sworn peace officers as defined in section 12-7-21 who are required by law or departmental policy to carry departmental firearms while on duty. The official use exemption does not apply to any officer's personal firearms. All personal firearms must be surrendered in accordance with section 15-15-3.

(b)(h) Upon motion by the plaintiff, his or her address shall be released only at the discretion of the family court judge.

(e)(i) (1) Any violation of the protective orders in subsection (a) of this section shall

subject the defendant to being found in contempt of court.

(2) The contempt order shall not be exclusive and shall not preclude any other available civil or criminal remedies. Any relief granted by the court shall be for a fixed period of time not to exceed three (3) years, at the expiration of which time the court may extend any order, upon motion of the plaintiff, for any additional time, that it deems necessary to protect the plaintiff from abuse. The court may modify its order at any time upon motion of either party.

~~(d)~~(j) (1) Any violation of a protective order under this chapter of which the defendant has actual notice shall be a misdemeanor which shall be punished by a fine of no more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or by imprisonment for not more than one year, or both.

(2) The penalties for violation of this section shall also include the penalties as provided by section 12-29-5.

AN ACT RELATING TO COURTS AND CIVIL PROCEDURE -- DOMESTIC ASSAULT

Mr. Speaker:

I hereby move to amend 2004 -- H 7369, entitled "AN ACT AN ACT RELATING TO COURTS AND CIVIL PROCEDURE -- DOMESTIC ASSAULT", as follows:

“SECTION 1. Legislative intent – In 1994 federal laws were enacted to prevent domestic violence abusers from purchasing and/or possessing firearms. Forty (40) states have enacted laws that restrict the possession of firearms in cases of domestic violence. It is the intent of the general assembly that the provisions of this act apply only to protective orders which are issued by a court after notice is given to the respondent and a full hearing on the complaint has taken place. It shall not apply temporary orders of protection under RIGL Section 15-5-4 or Section 8-8.1-4.

SECTION 2. Section 8-8.1-3 of the General Laws in Chapter 8-8.1 entitled "Domestic Assault" is hereby amended to read as follows:

8-8.1-3. Protective orders -- Penalty -- Jurisdiction. -- (a) A person suffering from domestic abuse may file a complaint in the district court requesting any order which will protect her or him from the abuse, including but not limited to the following:

(1) Ordering that the defendant be restrained and enjoined from contacting, assaulting, molesting or otherwise interfering with the plaintiff at home, on the street, or elsewhere, whether the defendant is an adult or minor;

(2) Ordering the defendant to vacate the household forthwith, unless the defendant holds sole legal interest in the household;

(3) Upon motion by the plaintiff, his or her address shall be released only at the discretion of the district court judge; and

(4) After notice to the respondent and a hearing, the court may order the defendant to surrender all firearms in their possession to their local police department.

(b) The district court shall provide a notice on all forms requesting a protective order that, at the hearing for a protective order, the defendant may be ordered to relinquish possession or control of any firearms and not to purchase or receive or attempt to purchase or receive any firearms for a period not to exceed the duration of the restraining order.

(c) If the defendant is present in court at a duly noticed hearing, the court may order the

defendant to relinquish any firearm(s) in that person's immediate possession or control, or subject to that person's immediate possession or control, within twenty-four (24) hours of the order, by surrendering the firearm(s) to the control of local law enforcement officials or by selling the firearm(s) to a federally licensed gun dealer. If the defendant is not present at the hearing, the defendant shall relinquish the firearm(s) within forty-eight (48) hours after being served with the order. A person ordered to relinquish any firearm(s) pursuant to this subsection shall file with the court a receipt showing the firearm(s) was either surrendered to the local law enforcement agency or federally licensed firearms storage facility or sold to a licensed gun dealer within seventy-two (72) hours after receiving the order.

(d) A local or state law enforcement agency may charge the defendant a fee for the storage of any firearm(s) pursuant to this section. This fee shall not exceed the actual cost incurred by the local or state law enforcement agency for the storage of the firearm(s). For purposes of this subsection, "actual cost" means expenses directly related to taking possession of a firearm(s), storing the firearm(s), and surrendering possession of the firearm(s) to a federally licensed firearms storage facility or to the defendant.

(e) Nothing in this section shall limit a defendant's right under existing law to petition the court at a later date for modification of the order.

(f) Unless otherwise prohibited by law, the offender shall have twenty (20) days from the expiration or termination date of the order to retrieve the firearm(s). If the legal owner of any firearm(s) deposited with the local or state law enforcement agency is otherwise prohibited by law from possessing or owning any firearm(s), said owner shall be entitled to sell or transfer the firearm(s) to a federally licensed firearms dealer and, if so, shall file a notarized receipt of said transfer/sale with the court. If the firearm(s) is not retrieved within the grace period, the law enforcement agency shall be entitled to destroy the firearm(s) at the defendant's expense.

(g) The prohibition against possessing a firearm(s) due solely to the existence of a domestic violence restraining order issued under this section shall not apply with respect to sworn peace officers as defined in section 12-7-21 who are required by law or departmental policy to carry departmental firearms while on duty. The official use exemption does not apply to any officer's personal firearms. All personal firearms must be surrendered in accordance with section 8-8.1-3.

~~(h)~~ (h) Any violation of the aforementioned protective order shall subject the defendant to being found in contempt of court.

~~(e)~~ (i) No order shall issue under this section which would have the effect of compelling a defendant who has the sole legal interest in a residence to vacate that residence.

~~(d)~~ (j) The contempt order shall not be exclusive and shall not preclude any other available civil or criminal remedies. Any relief granted by the court shall be for a fixed period of time not to exceed three (3) years, at the expiration of which time the court may extend any order upon motion of the plaintiff for such additional time as it deems necessary to protect the plaintiff from abuse. The court may modify its order at any time upon motion of either party.

~~(e)~~ (k) Any violation of a protective order under this chapter of which the defendant has actual notice shall be a misdemeanor which shall be punished by a fine of no more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or by imprisonment for not more than one year, or both.

~~(f)~~ (l) The penalties for violation of this section shall also include the penalties provided under section 12-29-5.
