**APPENDIX****TRIBUTE TO JOSEPH T. CORRENTE****By Representative Carter**

It is with a great deal of pride that I submit the name of Joseph T. Corrente of the City of Cranston for the naming of the new bridge carrying Interstate Route 195 over the Providence River on the so-called Hurricane Barrier Alignment.

A patriot of the highest order, Joseph T. Corrente, is a dedicated public servant and engineer, a decorated veteran of World War II and the Korean War and an outstanding community leader. His actions and accomplishments in military and civilian life exemplify the goodness of what people who apply themselves can attain in our still wonderful country.

Too often we overlook or fail to recognize ordinary people in our society who have devoted a lifetime of meritorious service to help improve the quality of life for all our citizens. Joseph Corrente is one of those ordinary people.

Corrente was born in Providence on November 27, 1923 of Italian immigrant parents. He was a lifelong resident of Providence until 1992 when he moved to Cranston. He attended Providence public schools, and graduated from Providence Technical Institute with an Associate Degree in Architectural Design and Construction.

He served his country during World War II in the U.S. Army in the European Theatre of Operations. 1950 he was recalled to active military duty in the Korean War serving with the 1343<sup>rd</sup> Engineer Combat Battalion. He was discharged in November 1951 after being wounded in the Battle of the Soyang River Bridge near the Punch Bowl combat area..

In 1952 and 1953, Corrente worked for the Providence Planning Commission as a planning technician.

He was a member of the project staff for the original relocation of the railroad and station from downtown Providence.

In June of 1954, he started his 32 years of distinguished and dedicated public service with the State of Rhode Island. He was the state's bridge resident engineer for the construction of the Providence River Bridge and approach roadway bridges in 1955 to 1958. For the next 15 years, Corrente was bridge resident in-charge of building some twenty bridges on the interstate routes and state primary highways.

From 1972 until his retirement in 1986, he held the position of bridge maintenance engineer, supervising the maintenance and repair of over 650 bridges, including the old Jamestown Bridge. In 1985, Corrente was nominated for one of the two annual Robert M. Goodrich Distinguished Public Service Awards. The awards are presented to exemplary career public employees by the Rhode Island Public Expenditure Council.

In 1989, Corrente was called out of retirement to be consultant on the interim deck repairs of the Providence River Bridge. This project prolonged the life and structural integrity of the old bridge until the new bridge for the relocation of I-195 south of the Hurricane Barrier could be built.

Corrente also worked for the Providence Public Works Department as a special assistant for maintenance management of bridges and the Hurricane Barrier in 1987 and 1988.

Corrente's contributions in bridge construction and maintenance engineering technology brought him a four-year appointment to the examination board for the Certification of Engineering Technicians. For this he received citations and commendations from the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials, Federal Highway Administration, and the National Society of Professional Engineers.

With his busy public service career, Corrente managed to be of service to his church and community. He served 27 years of continuous service as Lector at Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church in Providence, including co-chairman of the Neighborhood Improvement Committee to help stem urban blight from the area.

Upon his retirement from state service, instead of enjoying his well-deserved rest, Corrente continued his community service activity by accepting four successive 3-year appointments on the Governor's Commission on Disabilities. He is co-chairman of the accessibility committee in its role to oversee the compliance with federal ADA regulations of eliminating architectural barriers to the handicapped and the disabled. In conjunction with the safety of the disabled he serves on the R.I. Emergency Management Agency.

In 1988, he organized a successful drive by veterans and the performing arts community for the restoration of the Veterans Memorial Auditorium in Providence. For his untiring efforts for this project he was appointed to the Veterans Memorial Auditorium Foundation, an organization responsible for the management of VETS.

Corrente's participation in the Korean War led him to serve six years as an officer of the DAV (Disabled American Veterans). He was elected State Commander in 1962.

In 1994, as executive secretary of the United Veterans Council of R.I., an advocacy group of the eight major state veterans organizations, he successfully resolved the debate to relocate the World War I Monument to the Jackson-Gardner-Verrazano Park in Providence as part of the Capital Center River Relocation project.

Since 1997, Corrente has been co-chairman of building the Korean War Monument and Memorial Walkway in Providence. And now, with the same fervor of patriotic spirit, he is heading a committee to build World War II Memorial in Memorial Park, Providence.

For the last 12 years, Corrente has been as active member of the R.I Silver Haired Legislature, an advocacy group of older citizens concerned about issues affecting the state's elderly. The group consists of 100 members, similar to the Rhode Island House of Representatives. He served

three-two year terms as Speaker. In 1995, he was a delegate to the White House Conference on Aging held in Washington, D.C. The theme of the conference was Aging into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century: Investing in an Aging Society —Independence, Opportunity and Dignity for all Americans. During the same period, he also served on the Governor's Advisory Commission on Aging.

Since 1997, Corrente has been a member of the Howard Center Advisory Group for the orderly reuse of buildings in the proposed Rhode Island Government Center. Recently in his adopted City of Cranston, he accepted an appointment to the City Planning Commission.

Devoting a lifetime of public service and community and civic causes, Joseph Corrente embodies many qualities that make for a true American. It is people like him who served their country gallantly in the armed forces, and carried it over to the civilian life. And lastly, but most important, he never forgot being a loving husband, father and grandfather.

In February, 2001 Corrente was presented with the prestigious "Freeman Award" by The Providence Engineering Society for "Outstanding Achievement in Bridge Engineering and Maintenance Through the Application of Creativity and Innovation During a Lifetime of State Service." Recently in February of 2003 Corrente was cited by the Society's "Humanitarian Award," in recognition of faithful and long term community service to various civic, religious and public organizations.

On May 14, 2003, Governor Donald L. Carcieri presented Corrente with the coveted 2003 Joseph Vanni Award in recognition of his many years as a leading advocate for people with disabilities, Veterans and senior citizens.

On June 23, 2003, Corrente will receive the Rhode Island Foundation's Year 2000 Alan Shawn Feinstein Award for Outstanding Community Service.

And now, to cap all his awards for a lifetime of humankind service, Corrente has been selected as one of 400 - Korean War Veterans to attend the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Commemoration of the Signing of the Armistice Agreement on July 27, 2003 in Seoul, Korea.
