TO THE HONORABLE, THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

In accordance with the provisions of section 14, article IX of the Rhode Island Constitution and section 43-1-4 of the Rhode Island General Laws, I am transmitting herewith, with my disapproval, 2006-H 6874, "An Act Relating to Elections."

The bill would repeal, in its entirety, section 17-5-2 of the Rhode Island General Laws which authorizes Rhode Island Governors to submit non-binding questions to the voters at any election.

Since 1978, Governors of Rhode Island have had the ability to submit non-binding questions of public concern to the voters. Over the years, the power has been used sparingly but to good effect. Indeed, one of the most significant reform initiatives in the history of Rhode Island governance — separation of powers — had its start when Governor Almond placed the question before the voters in 2000 and again in 2002. The voters overwhelmingly approved the question in both elections. Until those nonbinding questions appeared on the ballot, the General Assembly had stymied every attempt by the people to pass separation of powers. The voters' overwhelming responses to these questions indicated clearly that the General Assembly should act. As this example demonstrates, the non-binding question is a powerful tool for the people to be heard.

Ironically, the bill's sponsors now use separation of powers as a pretext for stripping the Governor's ability to place non-binding questions before the voters. They claim these non-binding ballot questions intrude on their legislative prerogative — enacting laws. That

claim is false. Non-binding questions do not enact laws; they merely permit the Governor to ask about matters of public concern and for the voters to respond. No laws are enacted by the process regardless of the vote. Moreover, the Governor continues to play an important role in the legislative process even after separation of powers by submitting a consolidated budget, requesting the introduction of legislation for consideration by the General Assembly and, most importantly, exercising the veto. Claims that the Governor has no role in the legislative process ignore the very system of checks and balances that separation of powers is meant to ensure.

Sponsors of the bill also assert that Rhode Island is the only state that permits the voters to respond directly to non-binding questions asked by the Governor. Being unique simply does not make it wrong. It is worth noting that 24 other states have voter initiative, a process that permits voters to place binding questions on the ballot. Rhode Island does not.

This bill effectively stifles the ability of our citizens to be heard. It takes away an important avenue for the voters to speak directly to their elected officials — executive and legislative — on issues of critical public importance.

For these reasons, I disapprove of this legislation and urge your support of this veto.
