I am requesting that Senate Bill Number 15, AN ACT RELATING TO MOTOR AND OTHER VEHICLES – MOTER FUEL TAX, be removed, due to an error in the legislation. The proposed legislation was referred to the Senate Finance Committee on January 13, 2009. As of now the legislation would allow \$0.01 cent of the gas tax to go exclusively to RIPTA, which needs to be changed. I am requesting that this legislation be withdrawn until the error is corrected.
